

## Building starts on £¼ million nursery centre

CONSTRUCTION work has started on a £280,000 nursery centre in North Kensington, being built by the Westway Nursery Association and the Inner London Education Authority.

The centre is being built on land under the Westway, at Maxilla Gardens, leased from the North Kensington Amenity

Trust.

It combines a day nursery, parents' centre and nursery school and will offer 100 places for children aged six weeks to five years.

The day nursery is financed by Urban Aid grants, and the nursery school funded and maintained by the ILEA, providing 60 full-time places. The parents' centre, financed by the Vanessa Lowndes Trust

The parents' centre. financed by the Vanessa Lowndes Trust and the Gatsby Foundation, will include a mother and toddler club. snack bar, toy library and will be open in the evening for adult education and community activities.

The nursery centre will be

managed by a committee of representatives of the users, statutory authorities, and local voluntary bodies. The nursery school will have a separate managing group, who will also be members of the centre committee.

The planning of services and facilities at the centre is being done by the Association in consultation with the ILEA and Kensington and Chelsea Council.
